2020 AUDITIONS “Sounds of Tomorrow”

The Sanford Concert Series, in conjunction with the St. Mary’s County Arts Council, will sponsor “Sounds of Tomorrow” on June 14th at 7:30 p.m. at St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church. This concert is designed to allow local young musicians the opportunity to showcase their talents in a professional setting. Those selected to participate in the concert will receive an honorarium at the reception following the concert.

When:	Saturday, April 18, 2020
Where:	St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church, Route 4 in California, MD
Time:	TBD – pending # of applicants
Eligibility:	Open to all instrumentalists and vocalists, (solo or groups) in Southern Maryland age 18 and under who have not yet graduated from high school

Guidelines: Each person or group auditioning should be prepared to perform from memory a selection 5 to 10 minutes in duration demonstrating his or her musical capability. Students must provide their own accompanist if required. The selection should be commensurate with a level 4-6 of the Maryland State Music Educators guide for vocalists and instrumentalists and level 6 for pianists.
